Although this is a celebration, our black students remain well below the performance of their peers in all other subgroups. Reading and Math: Black 43.9, White 66.9, Hispanic 51.7 Science Black 51.6, White 81.8, Hispanic 77.8 We also want to place a focus on our (SWD) Students with Disabilities. Although they are considered to have met growth, we did not have enough to make a subgroup and they are also underperforming in all areas. Reading and Math SWD 13.5 Science 36.4 Our teams will meet bi weekly for data review in PLCs and bi weekly for MTSS after school. Our black students along with all underperforming students have been identified and will be tracked through MTSS/SST, with learning plans and in data PLC meetings.
