HOW TO REGISTER

Registration will take place during the months of February and March. Below are the instructions for how current 9th- 11th grade students will register for courses.

1. First, use the table below to see who you will be meeting with to discuss your course selections and post high school plans. If you are meeting with the AIG or EC coordinator, you will not have to meet with your counselor during registration.

- 2. Schedule a registration meeting with your counselor, or coordinator, during the dates of February 15 and March 5. If you do not schedule a meeting with them prior to that date, they will go ahead and schedule a time for you. Parents are more than welcome to join the registration meeting with their child.
- 3. Complete the registration <u>Google</u>
 <u>Form</u> by February 19. This form should be completed before your scheduled meeting with your counselor or coordinator. Any of the courses you select can end up on your schedule, so be sure to select carefully.
