3. SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE

3.01 Superintendent's Remarks - Dr. Marvin Connelly, Jr. (Information/Report)

This month, Dr. Connelly updated the Board on various notable points of pride:

<u>Observances</u>

Cumberland County Schools is celebrating the following observances during March:

- National Social Work Month
- Music in Our Schools Month
- National School Breakfast Week
- Women's History Month

The month kicked off with an Elementary All-County Chorus Concert (March 1) followed by an All-County Dance Clinic, which helped prepare students for a special performance in this year's Spring Evening of Dance on April 23 in the Crown Theater. Finally, CCS third-grade students are scheduled to visit the same theater on March 25 to see the Fayetteville Symphony in concert, featuring music from Peter and The Wolf.

Dr. Connelly took a moment to commend the outstanding efforts observed among the staff during recent school visits. He was particularly impressed by the commitment to delivering high-quality instruction across the district, finding it truly inspiring. As the academic year approached its final stretch, he emphasized the importance of maintaining a laser focus on the primary objective: providing equitable access to engaging learning opportunities that prepare students to be competitive, collaborative, and successful. Alongside the spring semester festivities, such as graduations and proms, he

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underscored the imperative of prioritizing the delivery of excellent instruction. Directly addressing the principals, he emphasized the significance of staying committed to the core mission. He urged them to rally together as a team, making every instructional moment count, with the shared goal of finishing the academic year stronger than ever.

NC Alliance of Black School Educators Conference Awards

Dr. Connelly highlighted the proud representation of Cumberland County Schools at the inaugural North Carolina Alliance of Black School Educators (NCABSE) Conference.

- He noted Board Member Carrie Sutton's receipt of the prestigious 2024 Local School Board award for her progressive
 policies benefiting all students in CCS.
- Dr. Latreicia Allen, principal of John Griffin Middle School, was recognized with the esteemed 2024 Risk Taker award
 for her remarkable dedication to advancing African American students and educators, showcasing her commitment to
 educational excellence.
- Executive Director of Federal Program Maria Ford's exceptional leadership as the NCABSE Treasurer was acknowledged, emphasizing her significant contributions to the organization's success.
- Dr. Zoletta Taylor, Student Success Facilitator, was celebrated with the 2024 'Rockstar President' award by NCABSE, honoring her outstanding leadership and tireless efforts in orchestrating the inaugural conference. Dr.
 Connelly commended her dedication to advancing NCABSE's mission and fostering excellence within the organization.

Gov. Cooper Visits E.E. Smith High School

Dr. Connelly summarized Governor Roy Cooper's recent visit to E.E. Smith High School, which aimed to showcase North Carolina's public school system. The governor toured classrooms to observe innovative teaching methods and engaged students. He also addressed a significant concern: the potential loss of \$17.2 million for Cumberland County Schools due to funds redirected to private school scholarships. While supporting parental choice, Dr. Connelly emphasized the importance of maintaining funds for public schools. He stressed the value of investing in public education for students, the workforce, and society. Additionally, Dr. Connelly highlighted the district's commitment to personalized learning and urged continued support and advocacy for increased funding for public education.

CCS Alumni Spotlight

Dr. Connelly concluded his update to the Board with a video clip of this month's CCS Alumni Spotlight. It featured South View High School graduate Susan Faircloth Dees, who currently works as the Chief Nursing Officer at Cape Fear Valley Medical Center.
