Betty Musselwhite, the associate superintendent of School Support Services, shared the following recognitions with the Board:

Beginning Teacher of the Year Award Finalists & Winner

Musselwhite introduced Kari Grates, the Beginning Teacher Support Coordinator, who presented CCS' Beginning Teacher of the Year Award Finalists Jaclyn Hamilton, a K-2 Austistic teacher at College Lakes Elementary School; Shakira Hodges, a CTE teacher at Ireland Drive Middle School; and Kendra LoSapio, a second-grade teacher at Elizabeth Cashwell Elementary School. Grates also presented the district's 2019-2020 Beginning Teacher of the Year winner, Damaris Prieto, a ninth-grade English teacher at South View High School. Prieto will go on to compete on the regional level in pursuit of the first North Carolina Center for the Advancement of Teaching (NCCAT) Beginning Teacher of the Year Award. The NCCAT Beginning Teacher of the Year process was developed to honor beginning teachers and to retain those who show promise as excellent teachers and educational leaders in North Carolina public schools and public charter schools.

Ellen Swinson, a bus driver at Ashley Elementary School, was recognized as October's Extra Mile Award recipient. Swinson was nominated by Carolyn Ortiz, a teacher assistant at Ashley Elementary, who praised her co-worker for her level of compassion in putting children first. She stopped to help the driver and offered the students an air-conditioned place to wait. After talking with school administrators at Vanstory Hills Elementary, Swinson happily finished the bus route so that the students would arrive home in a timely manner. The Extra Mile Award recognizes the contributions of the district's premier professionals to the overall mission and core values of Strategic Plan 2024.
