Board Agrees to Renew GPS Transportation Contract for Nearly 600 Vehicles

The Board approved renewing the Synovia GPS Transportation contract which will allow real-time tracking, mapping, reporting and alerting of the district's 492 yellow buses, 62 activity buses and 42 Transportation service vehicles. The software platform will provide GPS access to parents through HERECOMESTHE BUS.com so that they can be aware of when the bus will arrive at their child's stop. According to CCS' Executive Director of Transportation Dianne Grumelot, this feature will be piloted in the spring with all schools on board by the 2020-2021 school year. Grumelot said that the GPS system will also allow the Transportation Office to do a comparative analysis of time and attendance so that they can see what "a bus driver is actually doing
