Board Embraces Previous Sex Education Curriculum

After receiving recommendations from a review committee composed of community members, teachers, and administrators, the Board voted to embrace the locally developed Middle School Reproductive Health & Safety Lessons that were implemented in 2009. The curriculum, which was updated in 2013 by Cumberland County Health Educators, meets all the requirements of the Healthy Youth Act and offers an 'opt out' component. The curriculum allows sixth graders to focus on interpersonal communication and relationships. A parent component and supporting teacher scripts for class lessons will be developed to accompany the curriculum.

Douglas Byrd middle schools so that they would both educate $6^{th} - 8^{th}$ graders. Ireland Drive Middle would change from a 6^{th} - grade-only school while Douglas Byrd Middle would transform from a 7^{th} - 8^{th} -grade school to a $6^{th} - 8^{th}$ -grade middle school. Parent, teacher, and community feedback was collected in creating the proposal, which educators feel would create comprehensive 6^{th} - 8^{th} middle schools that would fully embrace the middle school concept, allow for the establishment of a PTA/PTO, share athletic programs, and make vertical planning easier to facilitate among the elementary feeder schools.
