# Superintendent Updates the Board

Dr. Connelly began his update by congratulating the district's Successful Students and Premier Professionals for completing the second nineweek period of the traditional school year. Afterward, he shared the following information:

# Successful Students in the Arts

CCS Arts Education program has experienced an incredible month showcasing talented students during the 2021 Fall Evening of Dance, the 2021 All-County Band, Orchestra and Chorus concerts, and the NC School Boards Association Student Contest, which was entered by many CCS students. He also noted Massey Hill Classical High School's theatre group received multiple awards for their performance during the NC Theatre Conference.

# Choice Program

CCS Choice Programs launched its application period on November 29 and hosted the Virtual Choice Fair on December 4. Scores of families attended the event to learn about the uniquely tailored educational experiences and opportunities the program has to offer. The Choice application period for the 2022-2023 school year will continue through January 31.

# We Remain #Cumberland Strong

During the weekend, a small fire caused minor smoke damage in the main Central Services building, located at 2465 Gillespie Street. No one was harmed. CCS Staff are working closely with external fire and smoke restoration personnel to begin the clean-up process and to assess the area impacted by the fire. In the interim, a majority of Central Services staff have been relocated to office buildings and schools across the district. # Do Our Part

A reminder was shared that during the Winter break, we can 'do our part' to help prevent further spread of COVID-19 by wearing our masks, waiting 6 feet apart and washing our hands. Additionally, Dr. Connelly made an appeal to consider vaccinating children ages 5 years and older against the virus.

He closed his comments with a short video that highlights the hard work and achievements of several Successful Students across the district.

# Air Purifiers Approved for Classrooms

In an effort to improve air quality as recommended by the CDC in the fight against the spread of COVID-19, the Board approved the purchase of about 2,500 classroom air purifiers from Air Doctor, LLC (the small units) and U.S. Air Purifiers, LLC (the medium units). The purifiers, which will be purchased using ESSER funds, will be installed in classrooms and common areas throughout CCS.

#### Board Gives 'Thumbs Up' to Service Agreements, MOA

Members of the Board agreed that the 2021-2022 SRO (School Resource Officer) agreement of services will resume between the Cumberland County Sheriff's Department and Cumberland County Schools. Also, the Cumberland County Board of Education will continue its partnership with the Action Pathways, Inc., and a memorandum of agreement between the Board and the Communities In Schools (CIS) of NC Services, Group, LLC, was also approved.

#### 60 Activity Buses to Get WiFi

The Board gave 'a thumbs up' to CCS Technology hardwiring 60 (white) activity buses with ConnectED wi-fi service using Premier Wireless Business Technology Solutions under a Choice Partners National Purchasing Cooperative contract. The connectivity will support students who participate in extracurricular activities that require travel during the school day. Students can access instructional programs from the bus while participating in these activities. It was also noted that this capability will place the district in a position to expand its availability of high-speed internet access for remote learning when necessary.

The Board voted 7-2 to retain the existing masking policy (COVID-19 Face Coverings Policy Code: 6141). As required by North Carolina Session Law 2021-130 (Senate Bill 654), "the Board shall vote at least once per month either to maintain this policy in its current form or to modify it."

The 2020 and 2021 Board Chair Alicia Chisolm and Vice Chair Greg West received special recognition for successfully serving two terms in their respective positions. For their years of service leading the nine-member Board, Chisolm was given a gavel-plaque and West received a framed certificate presented by Board member Deanna Jones.
