## Superintendent Updates the Board

Superintendent Dr. Connelly opened his update by sharing that October is a month filled with many recognitions and celebrations within the district and across the nation. He asked that we be mindful of the following: National Hispanic Heritage Month, Indigenous Peoples Day in North Carolina (October 12), Breast Cancer Awareness Month, National Principals Month, and Cumberland County Schools' Administrators of the Year (AOY) Virtual Celebration (October 19 at 6:30 p.m., via the district's YouTube channel). As we enter into the colder months of the year, Dr. Connelly emphasized the importance of following the 3W's (Wear masks, Wait 6 feet, Wash your hands) to help prevent the spread of COVID-19 and the seasonal flu. He also thanked CCS students, educators, staff, families and community members for doing their part in helping every child be successful. #### **Board Approves New, Updated Policies**

The nine-member Board approved new policy 4334/5035/7345 Use of Unmanned Aircraft (Drones) and Title IX policy 1710/4020/7320 Discrimination and Harassment Prohibited by Federal Law. Revisions to Policy Code: 8325 Daily Deposits were accepted where "regardless of the amount on hand, all funds must be deposited on the last business day of each month" instead of also depositing funds at the end of each school week.

#### Superintendent, Cabinet Contracts Extended

The Board approved extending the contract of Superintendent Dr. Marvin Connelly and that of his Cabinet for an additional year with no change to the financial terms of their contracts.

### **Board Members' Update**

During the Board Members' update, it was agreed that an invitation would be extended to Cumberland County Health Director Dr. Jennifer Green to attend a Board Committee meeting in order to share an update about local COVID metrics. Board members said they felt this information would help them make informed decisions about the future of the district.
